Do you have at least two years of experience performing landscaping activities for commercial, public, and/or institutional properties or as part of a regulated integrated vegetation management program? Do you possess or are you interested in pursuing your Qualified Applicator License? Do you enjoy working outdoors as part of a crew? If so, check out this opportunity.

The Maintenance Worker I/II in the Vegetation Unit will be responsible for a variety of vegetation control and revegetation projects in support of flood control and stream maintenance activities. During a typical day, Maintenance Workers may be involved in installing plants, watering plants, maintaining planting sites, weeding, mowing, running chainsaws, spraying herbicides, or hauling landscape materials. They will operate support vehicles and construction and maintenance equipment and may help oversee the work of outsourced contractors.

This position works outside and can sometimes be subjected to difficult environmental conditions such as cold, heat, rain, or poison oak. There could be times when this position is called out at night to perform flood control during emergencies. If you are up to this challenge, apply now!

• Clear brush, weeds, and debris from worksites, canals, ponds, creeks, reservoirs, pipelines, water treatment plants, dams, and other open areas; prune vegetation, perform tree removals including standing or downed trees.

• Prepare soil and install native plant revegetation per established plans; maintain mitigation areas to achieve success criteria and meet monitoring requirements.

• Install, adjust, and repair irrigation systems, including heads, lines, and controllers.

• Operate a variety of small power tools and light equipment, including spray equipment, mowers, chain saws, weed eaters, pole saw, hydro seeder, small trenchers, loader, compactors, water trucks, forklift, straw mulcher, auger, sandbag machine, and chipper; clean, adjust, and perform minor maintenance on light equipment to ensure proper operating condition.

• Perform general fencing installation and repair functions; assist skilled trades staff with various assignments.

• Build or remove browse cages, or other devices to keep wildlife from damaging native plant revegetation sites. Build phytosanitary benches, fences, irrigation, etc. in support of native plant holding facility.

• Participate in the Valley Water's sandbag program when needed.

• Perform calculations of required work materials; document daily application of chemical use; photo documentation of work, complete work order dailies, checklists, surveys, forms, and time data entries.

Must have a satisfactory driving record and a valid California Class B driver's license with tanker and air brake endorsements at the time of hire.

Possession of or ability to obtain, a Qualified Applicator's Certificate or Qualified Applicator License in Categories C and F issued by the State of California's Department of Pesticide Regulation.
